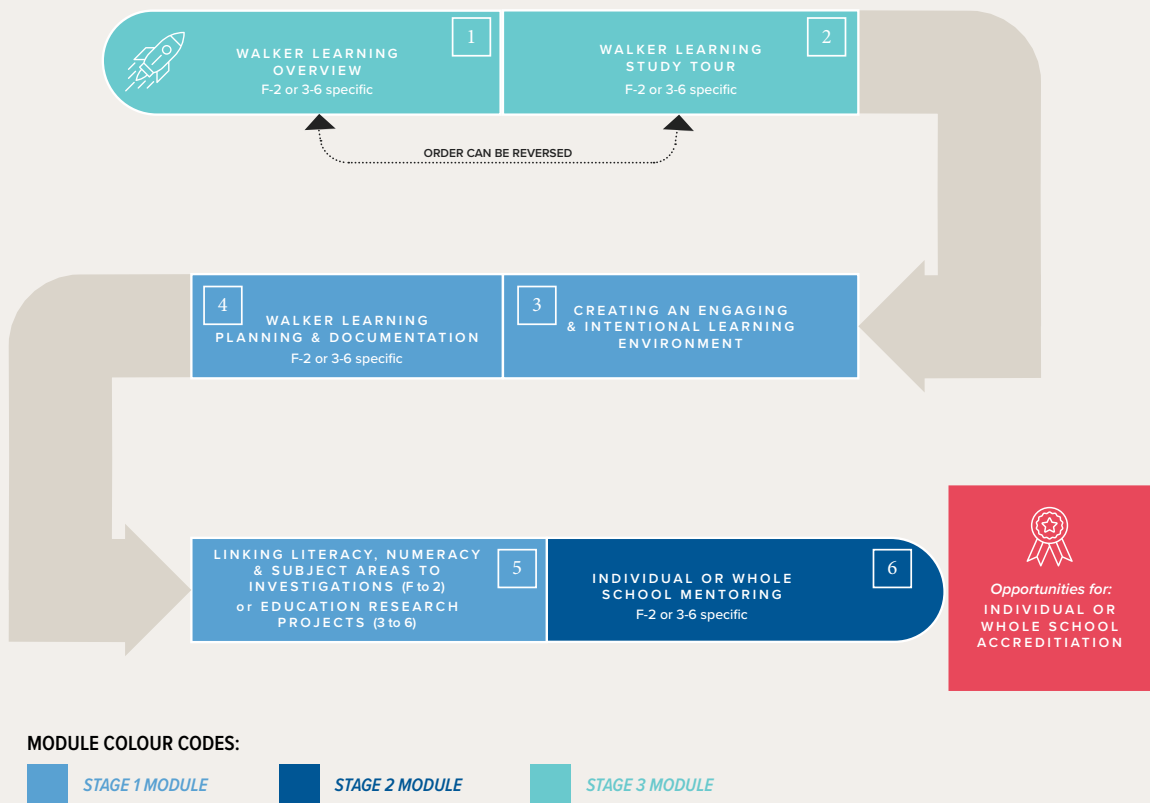
The Walker Learning Pathway

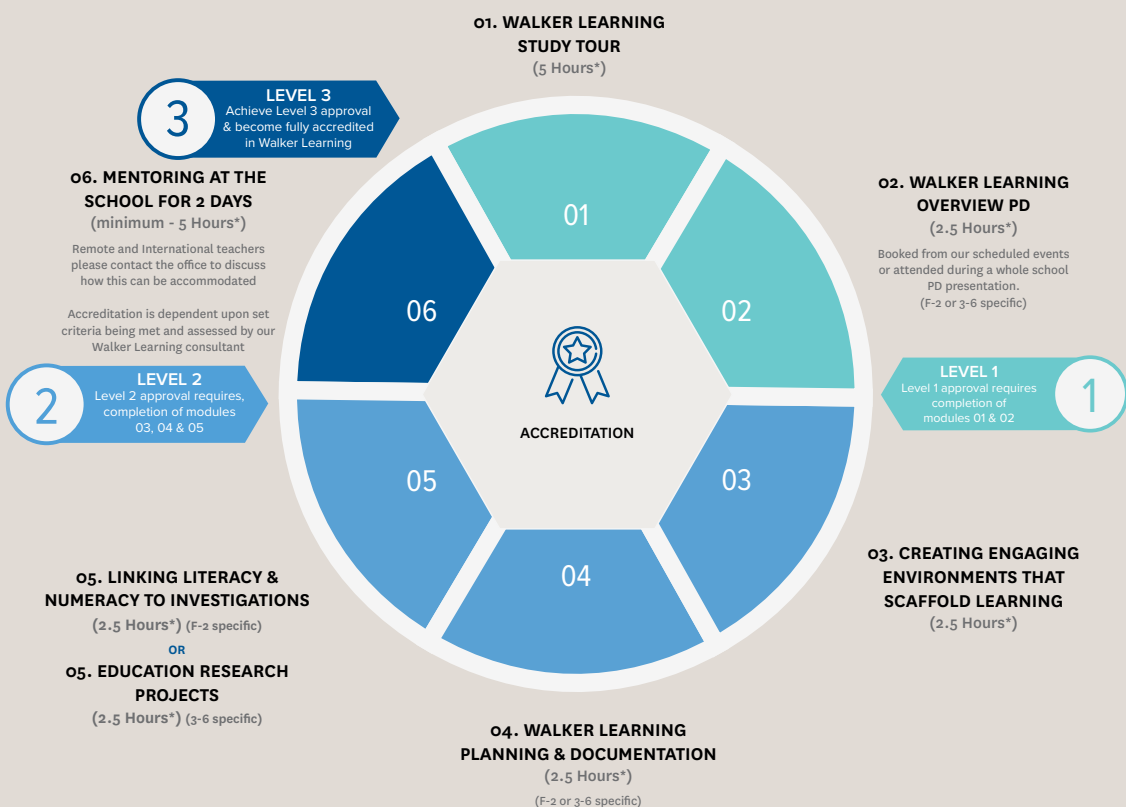

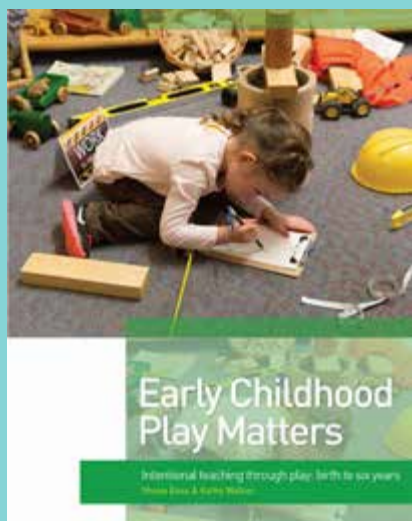
